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## ANATP/BNATP Monthly Update March 2023

- 1. Effective January 1, 2023, programs can now admit students with an ITIN. The HCWR has been programmed to accept ITINs and the certification exam will allow you to enter an ITIN on the roster. Bear in mind that an ITIN does not give an individual work authorization, nor does achieving a CNA certification. It would be best practice to include counseling for those students that they may not be able to legally work after completing a BNATP.
- 2. All programs must begin separating their theory hours from lab hours and enter the total number of lab hours on page two of the Master Schedule. There is a minimum requirement of 16 hours of lab for those programs who only offer the minimum required 80 hours of theory.
- For RNs wishing to teach who do not take the Train the Trainer course, the Program Coordinator for the program where you will be teaching must apply for your approval to teach and your instructor code. RNs with a Train the Trainer can obtain their instructor code independently. Complete the form at the link below. - 5. The new master schedule will be online soon. There are some changes and additional instructions for when to send revisions. As all instructors are approved to teach theory, lab, and clinicals those check boxes have been removed. You only have to list your instructors and their codes. CPR is the only check box left. You would enter the instructor or the company that is providing CPR instruction and check that box.
